From the Heart of Fr. Costas

January 1st is the first official day of the year in the Gregorian calendar which is followed in most countries. This is commonly referred to as the "New Calendar."

In some Orthodox Churches, the civil New Year falls on January 14th, which corresponds to January 1st in the Julian Calendar, otherwise known as the "Old Calendar." Some Orthodox Christians celebrate both the Gregorian and Julian New Year holidays, with the Gregorian day celebrated as a civic holiday, and the Julian date as the "Old New Year," a religious holiday. The Churches own liturgical calendar begins on September 1st, the Ecclesiastical New Year. For the Church, the celebration of Christ's birth comes first (Christmas). Then His death and resurrection in the spring (Pascha), then His Ascension in the summer followed by Pentecost and the Dormition of the Theotokos in the summer.

Most of the Orthodox Churches have adopted the Gregorian (New) calendar administratively and the civic and religious holidays match. The Orthodox populations of Bulgaria, Cyprus, Egypt, Greece, Poland, Romania, Syria, and Turkey celebrate the New Year on January 1st. The Orthodox Churches of Georgia, Jerusalem, Russia, and Serbia still use the Julian Calendar.

Time is something we naturally think about during the New Year. Time should be different for us Christians. We like to say that we live in the KAIROS rather than in time, because *kairos* means a well-defined time period which is lived in for the purpose of eternity. In a few

words, our goal in this life becomes eternity as we live in the eschatological time, or the time of the end. A Christian lives in the world, yet he is ordered by our Lord to be away from the world, that is, not to be secular and worldly, but spiritual.

Time as *kairos* becomes a great opportunity for good deeds. We can pray more, study the Holy Scriptures and attend more services of the Orthodox Church with enthusiasm and zeal. St. Paul tells us that we should buy time and use it wisely for our spiritual benefit.

None of us knows how much time we have left. Our Faith tells us the *kairos* is short, important and will make the difference for our future life.

It is wrong to count time in hours and seconds. We should count first our blessings from God and others and at the same time add more Godlike acts to our spiritual report card. Do you produce enough spiritual fruit each year? Do you often cleanse yourself from sin by coming to Holy Confession? Do you live your life according to the Commandments of God?

At this New Year, let us think about the importance and value of TIME, dear brothers and sisters. May this understanding bring about our salvation. I wish you a blessed, spiritual and prosperous New Year full of eternal achievements and pleasant surprises.

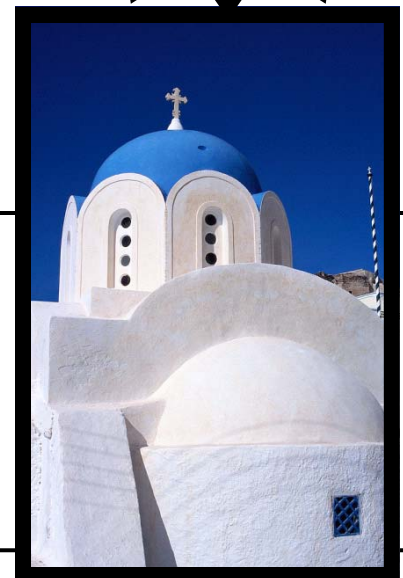

Parish "Wish List"

Donors would be appreciated for part or all of the items below which are badly needed. All of these items are important and will be used for years to come. Please let Father know if you will be willing to help with any of the these items:

SERVICE BOOKS - Father would like the have new Divine Liturgy service books for use on Sundays. The book he has in mind has the entire service with all of the prayers in Greek, Greek Phonetics, and English. This is not the "green book" with the music that we are currently using, which is incomplete. To provide the new Divine Liturgy service books will cost \$400.00

ORTHODOX BIBLES - The new, complete Orthodox Study Bible, with the Old and New Testaments, will become available in February. They retail at \$50.00 each (hard copy), but if we preorder them before February and buy them in bulk, we can get them at a 45% discount. We would like to have 50 Bibles at our parish available for use at future Bible studies, retreats, services, etc.

BLACK ACOLYTE ROBES - Some of you remember from last year that on Holy Week the acolytes (altar boys) were dressed in black robes, rather than their usual gold ones. This is more appropriate especially for Holy Week. The robes were borrowed - some were cassocks, some were not, and there were not enough in the right sizes for our boys. Presvytera barely managed to gather up enough black robes to robe all of the boys. We could and should have our own on hand. Cassocks can be ordered and cost approximately \$50.00 each, depending on size. They are easy to maintain - washable and permanent press with a snap down front. We should probably have about 15 of them in a variety of sizes, since the mix of boys serving varies from year to year. The cassocks could also be used for Lenten and other services. You have seen what the cassocks look like. The Liturgical Readers have been wearing them when they read the Epistle. The Liturgical Readers have each acquired their own cassocks, but we need cassocks which will remain at the church for use by the altar boys.
