From the Heart of Fr. Costas

My Dearest Ones,

Rejoice in the Lord Jesus!

June is the month which long ago was dedicated to the goddess Hera or Juno, the wife of Zeus. But for the Christians it became the month of the 12 Apostles. The Church, realizing that the summer months are a time that temptations are stronger since the heat makes people more lax and less dressed, has established two periods of fasting in the summer: one in June and one in August.

The dates and length of the Fast of the 12 Apostles varies each year depending upon the date of Pascha, which in turn determines the date of Pentecost. Sometimes the Fast of the Apostles is one week in length, other times it is longer. This year it is from June 4 to June 29 because Pascha was early.

Not only do we honor all Twelve Apostles, but Saints Peter and Paul are honored before the rest. Peter and Paul were the two most important men in the infant Christian Church through the perilous years of the early life and launched it on its great missionary career of converting the world to Christ.

These two giants of the Church were quite dissimilar. Peter was a fisherman. Paul, a tentmaker and scholar. Peter was married. Paul was single. Peter had little formal education. Paul was a graduate of the finest schools. Peter was a simple, impulsive man; Paul was a

thinking man, almost a philosopher of great erudition.

But Peter and Paul had one thing in common: they were united in their complete devotion to Jesus Christ. Both labored hard in the vineyard of the Lord and for a very long time. Finally both sealed with their blood the testimony of their strong faith and both were martyred in the first Roman persecution of Christians under the Emperor Nero. Peter was crucified upside down and Paul was beheaded with a sword.

Peter, as one of the original twelve, was present at the major events of Jesus' life, but he denied Him three times. He was the mouth of the Apostles and the prime mover in getting the Christian message in Palestine.

Paul, while not one of the original twelve, never-the-less considered himself to be a true apostle of Christ. Indeed, he became the greatest of the apostles, giving all of us hope and courage to surpass even the disciples in our love for Jesus.

Let us imitate these great men and all the apostles of the Lord in our love for Christ. Do not abandon Christ or His Church during the summer. Wherever you are—at home or away—come to Church on Sundays.

Baby George Giakos was born on March 12, 2007 with a brain tumor that took up 80% of the left side of his head. This valiant angel has survived brain surgery and four blood transfusions. A biopsy determined that the tumor was stage 4 cancer. Baby George is now undergoing chemotherapy and will need another surgery to remove remnants of the tumor at the brain stem.

On June 17th, the family of Baby George will be hosting the coffee hour. The coffee hour is the 40-day memorial of Martha Giakos, Baby George's grandmother who tragically passed from this life recently.

It will be a wonderful opportunity for us all to meet the Giakos' and show our support of them during this very difficult period.

Oriente Lumen Conference for the West Coast, June 2007

The speakers are notable theologians and church representatives from all over America and abroad. The subject for the presentation this year is "Icons-Expressions of our Faith" and one of the speakers this year is our own Metropolitan Gerasimos. CHURCH READERS WANTED TO BE TRAINED

We are going to begin a program to train people to become tonsured Readers. Except for the Gospel which is only read by a deacon or priest, all scripture readings (such as the Epistle, prophecies, psalms, etc) are actually supposed to be done by people who have been specifically blessed and tonsured by the bishop to perform this service in a Church. A similar blessing (Heirotheisia) is done for Psaltes and Acolytes (altar boys). Readers are called "Anagnostes" and the practice of having Anagnostes be responsible for reading the scriptures was a practice from the earliest centuries of Christianity. When our Metropolitan Gerasimos visited us last fall, he tonsured a number of boys into the ranks of Acolytes. We hope to tonsure some people to become Readers in the future, but they must first be trained and educated. If anyone is interested in learning more about this, please talk to Presvytera Jeannie.
